Job Title: Housekeeper

Job Purpose:

Undertake the necessary cleaning duties to ensure that cleanliness standards are achieved, and infection control protocols maintained as determined by the Cleaning Supervisor and Head of Care. You will part of a team of housekeepers working on a rolling rota which may include some weekends. We are looking for someone who will build professional and caring relationships with residents, who you will have regular contact with throughout the day.

Key Responsibilities:

- Cleaning of walls, floors and windows;
- Cleaning communal areas;
- Cleaning of toilets and hand basins;
- Vacuuming, dusting and mopping;
- Laundry management;
- Touch point cleaning;
- PPE stock top ups;
- Preparing residential rooms and apartments for lettings;
- Deep cleans of all areas where required;
- Ordering and stock check of cleaning products;
- Cleaning of individual resident apartments where required.

This job description is non-contractual and it will be reviewed from time to time and may be subject to change.

Working Hours	We offer a rolling rota pattern, to include weekend work. Shift patterns are available between the hours of 08:00am and 20:00pm.
